Item 5 a. Presentations/Delegations

- Dotty Nwakanma from Carleton University's Registrar's office was present and gave a presentation about the new First-Year Grading Policy.
 - The first-year grading policy 5.4.3 was passed this year. This policy is for new and first-year Carleton Undergraduate Degree students with no previous post-secondary education. In other words, this policy is for students who are entering Carleton straight out of high school. The policy allows students who are eligible for the first two terms to designate two credits for their courses for a passing course. The designated grade would be labelled as CR. Due to Carleton's compassionate grading during the pandemic, students could designate courses as 'SAT' grades, which would help with their CGPA. Therefore, the first-year grading policy stemmed from the 'SAT' passionate grading policy.
 - At a student's request, if a student fails a class, the grade will automatically be converted to NR (no record), which will not impact their CGPA. Additionally, failed courses will not show up on the student's transcript. However, the Registrar's Office will keep the course grade for their own records. Also, a student's transcript will not show WDN (withdrawn).
 - This policy is not capped per term. However, students must wait until their second term to make the decision to convert any of their grades to CR.
 - This policy was one of CASG's proposals that were approved and modified.

• Clarification points:

- This first-grade policy does not apply to students in their second year at Carleton University and taking first-year courses.
- This first-year grading policy does not affect students' CGPA. However, for scholarships, the Awards and Financial Aid office will look at the student's underlying percentage grades.
- This first-year grading policy does not apply to students with any previous post-secondary background. The idea is that this policy is to help with the transition into university. Thus, it is for students with no prior university experience.
- If students have difficulty calculating their grades, they can contact the Academic Advising Centre to receive assistance with calculating their grades.
- If a student takes a semester off but is still in their first year, they can still use the first-year grading policy.
- The deadline for this first grading policy: opens for students at the end of April, and they have a whole term to decide whether or not they want to convert any of their grades. This ensures that students see their final grades from both semesters before deciding.
- If a student has a scholarship, the scholarship will use the percentage to be converted.
